The Lama lives in a wooden house built by followers, which is in a mountainous area around 5,000 meters high. Every day, countless people from the major Tibetan regions travel across the mountains to visit him in order to seek for the answer for their own lives. They consult with him regarding the questions, such as "Where did my deceased relatives go?" "What is the cause of my headache?" "What should I do if my son is sent to jail?" "Is it still possible for me to remarry my ex-wife?". Meanwhile, the water on the stove was boiled, and the believers wait outside taking off their shirts one by one, ready to get the unique "answer" from the Lama.....





Xavier continued to contribute impressive scores at Taipei Municipal Stadium in the following seven years. Meanwhile, the inevitable issue of the retirement age has finally approached him. He pondered on his identity as a Taiwanese child and decided to play his last career game at Taipei Municipal Stadium. However, what awaited them is Bahrain whose world ranking is beyond higher than Taiwan.

Before the match, Xavier's leg injury recurred thus he missed out on the pre-game training. Xavier carried collective expectation to the match. Despite the pain, he faced the formidable opponent Bahrain unshakably.

With whistle lingering in the air, this is going to be the final match of his life.



Memories revisited each time in different form like the waves beat on the shore, then vanish, THIS SHORE: a family story is an experimental documentary which opens with a story of my family: my American aunt found a painting of my grandmother by chance, in a random Chinese restaurant in the middle of nowhere - she said she cried. By tracing this story and reproducing its meaning, the film wonders through different topics: the construction of the Cold War, USA and Taiwan relations, different generations of Chinese diaspora since the 1950s, contemporary immigration and cross-nation fluidity, family romances, religion, and ancestors...The film gradually turns to another tale. The "real" histories, personal or collective memories, gradually being reformed into a fictional fantasy of The Flying Dutch Man.

Tzu-An Wu makes experimental films. He likes to manipulate heterogeneous images, sounds, and texts, to question the construction of the parrative and the selfhood. In recent years he works mainly with Super 8 and 16mm film techniques, while he is also interested in the intersection of both analog and digital techniques of visual reproduction. 

As people find their love, they get married and expect happiness. However, after the ceremony, love is no longer the only matter bonding the two; the complexities of reality are added to the play. To engage into a conversation is the only possible way to dissolve the boundary between the two individuals.

LOVE Talk discloses the daily conversations between eight young and mature couples. Their trivial dialogues about "love" comprise topics ranging from sex life, parenting, housework division, problems with their mother-in-law, and even feeling fatigue and dull towards their marital life. These conversations reflect the authenticity of characters' living condition, exploring the depth of intimate relationship in marriage while shedding a dim light on the significance of happiness at the same time. Perhaps this sort of happiness lies in the journey where seeking is the end itself, and happiness is certainly unable to be captured and fixed in a frame.



THE PRICE OF **DEMOCRACY**

The director LIAO, a confused twenty something looks back upon the 40-year-history of democratization in Taiwan through the life experiences of two old-timers, who are grass-root rebels. He attempts to discover what causes their actions and decisions to be political activists, and what are their limitations and sacrifice.

The two protagonists are TSENG, a female novelist, who got divorced because of her political idealism in the era of White Terror; and KANG, a canvasser who is known as a "Microphone Man". KANG was an energetic young person on the streets during the 80' but now living in hardship. On the other hand, TSENG needs to tackle her emotional trauma during her resistances experiences of old days.

LIAO's confusion appears, which connects different sections dealing with the past and present, presenting the interaction and mutual gazes between the director and the interviewees. The director gradually realizes that the real battlefield for everyone is life itself.



Before World War II, "Green Jail" was a large-scale mining village under Greater East Asia Imperialism which imprisoned thousands of miners. These miners were from Kyushu, Japanese colonies Taiwan and Korea, and other places of Japan.

Grandma Hashima, the daughter of the head of colonial Taiwanese miners YANG Tien-fu, experienced the coal mine days in Okinawa. She's already 92 years old, living alone in an old shaggy wooden house. What has happened in the coal mine? Grandma's adoptive father, who recruited hundreds of Taiwanese miners to "Green Jail", making them not able to get back to Taiwan nor leave the jail... Is he an assaulter or a victim of Japanese Imperialism?

This film portrays the last years of Grandma Hashima's life with her memory of crime, pain, anger and the miserable history throughout 80 years.







Dokufest featured a large retrospective of 23 Taiwan films in Prizren, Kosovo. Based on an idea of presenting Taiwanese history, identity, people's power and daily life, this program is a show of Taiwanese filmmaking that spans almost a hundred years of Taiwan history, from the Japanese colonial period to the student-led sunflower movement in 2014. It includes films by internationally acclaimed masters, as well as recent works by up-and-coming talented directors, and covers all genres, from documentary, experimental video, to fiction. It is the first time that an Asian country is presented at the festival in Balkan area.

From assisting programmers in contacting with rights-holders through to collecting screening and promotional materials, Taiwan Docs helps to make this collaboration possible from the beginning to the end. Moreover, Taiwan Docs subsidizes part of screening fee, filmmakers' traveling fee and post-production cost. Along with screenings and Q&A with filmmakers, Taiwan Day event was held with the support of Taipei Representative Office, Budapest, Hungary. This comprehensive retrospective arouse resonance and conversations among international audience in Dokufest, and Taiwan films had a great opportunity to be presented from a new perspective.




